More than 40 kids inspired to swim Alcatraz

In May, seven year-old super swimmer Braxton Bilbrey became the world's youngest person to paddle from Alcatraz to San Francisco.

"I think it's pretty cool," said Braxton as exited the water to a crowd of repoerters.

In September, swimming Alcatraz again, and the stretch beneath the the Golden Gate bridge. Braxton became to youngest to do both in the same year. Braxton did it in the same weekend.

"He was the youngest kid to ever swim it, and he's on our team. I wanted to try it," said "Swim Neptune" team member Austin Collins.

Now, Braxton and his coach Joe Zemaitas are raising the stakes.

"We have close to 40 or 50 swimmers that are going to make the swim on April 25th, ranging in age from 8 to 17," said Zemaitas.

Braxton's brave journey brought in \$13,000 dollars for drowning prevention. This time with team "Swim Neptune" strong behind him, the goal's shot up to \$100,000 dollars. For these kids, it's a cause worthy of putting their fears aside, so others don't have to be afraid of the water.

"I'm going to tell you s story. Once, my brother was walking along the pool fence, because he wanted to brush the bottom of the pool with one of those pool brushes and he fell in. My dad jumped in with his cell phone and everything on. He had to pull Carson out. I was just right there and I was shocked. I couldn't really move," said Colin Hart, "Swim Neptune" team member.

"I was afraid of the sharks, but now I know I'm going to be safe, because there's a 1-percent chance I'm going toi be eaten by shark," said Sierra Barnes, "Swim Neptune" team member.

"To my knowledge this has never been done before, but just like there had never been a seven year old who had done it before, we're not afraid of trying new things," said Zemaitas.
